

## Summer Reading Activity

Research has shown that reading over the summer months helps to reduce the summer slide.

In the reading section of your report card it will state your *current independent reading level*. You are encouraged to visit the following websites to find books that align with your level and choose one of the following activities to complete about each book you will read. You are expected to read at-least 3 books over the summer.

1. Create a book jacket, including illustrations, an enticing synopsis/summary, author bio, and favorable reviews.
2. Explain why you think this book will or will not be read 100 years from now. Support your opinion by stating specific events in the story.
3. Write a different ending for the book (at least 1 page written)
4. Write a letter to a friend recommending the book you have just read (at least 1 page written)
5. Create a travel brochure for the setting of the story and about key characters.
6. Book Report form printed from Weebly.

Turn in your 3 activities with the rest of your summer packet on the first day of fifth grade!
